### **Dear Parents/Guardians**

Welcome to Week 2 of Term 2. This term may present challenges for students, teachers and families as we move to a new way of remote teaching and learning, but one which I am sure we can work through positively together. Where possible, we have planned to keep the structure similar to a normal school day with activities following our Term 2 curriculum.

Teachers will use the Parent Portal as the main means of communicating with parents. At the start of each week, we will provide your child with a weekly plan of activities focusing on Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry. We will provide some general resources (such as those in this pack) and also include specific lessons for your child to complete with your support. Specialist teachers will provide ideas for lessons which your child will be able to access. Parents can use the portal for students to send any written tasks as an attachment or photo to their teacher who can then provide feedback. Many of the activities can be shared with family members, and parents can give immediate feedback or support as required.

Teachers will have access to your child's progress through the Literacy and Numeracy online programs and will set work via these platforms in the weeks to come.

Remote learning is very new for all of us and we understand that families will approach this in different ways, but it is important to stay connected to school. We have provided key Literacy and Numeracy learning along with other activities which should take a few hours a day. A school day at home may be quite different from a normal day in the classroom. Children normally attend school from 9am to 3.30pm, but at home, these times may be flexible. Teachers have planned work which may be completed in a shorter time frame than a whole school day due to different variables including discussion times, breaks and family routines. We don't expect students to be completing school work for 6 hours a day. Please refer to the DET website for specific information about remote learning times for students from Prep – Grade 2 and for those in Grade 3 – Grade 6. We do encourage parents to be guided by their child and give them regular breaks. Please remember that it is important for children to get fresh air and keep active. There are plenty of fun activities that they might like to do from the 'Activities To Do At Home' link that you have already received through the parent portal.



**VCOP:** This stands for **V**ocabulary, **C**onnectives, **O**peners & **P**unctuation. Currently in prep we are only focusing on the <u>vocabulary</u> to make it interesting (wow words) and simple <u>punctuation</u>.

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The Gallipoli Campaign was an attack on the Gallipoli peninsula during World War I, between 25 April 1915 and 9 January 1916.

The Gallipoli peninsula was an important tactical position during World War I. The British War Council suggested that Germany could be defeated by attacks on her allies, Austria, Hungary and Turkey.

The Allied forces of the British Empire (including Australia and New Zealand) aimed to force a passage through the Dardanelles Strait and capture the Turkish capital, Constantinople.

At dawn on 25 April 1915, Anzac assault troops landed north of Gaba Tepe, at what became known as Anzac Cove, while the British forces landed at Cape Helles on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

The campaign was a brave but costly failure

By December 1915 plans were drawn up to evacuate the entire force from Gallipoli. On 19 and 20 December, the evacuation of over 142,000 men from Anzac Cove commenced and was completed three weeks later with minimal casualties.

In total, the whole Gallipoli campaign caused 26,111 Australian casualties, including 8,141 deaths.

Since 1916 the anniversary of the landings on 25 April has been commemorated as Anzac Day, becoming one of the most important national celebrations in Australia and New Zealand.


