PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2C AND 5B PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS – Tuesday 21st March

Interviews will be open from tomorrow and close 20th March at 10:00am. **Please note that children in these grades are required to attend school on Tuesday 21st March as we will be employing CRTs to supervise both grades.**

SKATE SHOES AT SCHOOL & RISK MANAGEMENT

We have noticed an increasing number of children are wearing skate shoes to school. Unfortunately, they pose a serious injury risk for other children and themselves during lunch and recess breaks when converted to skates. Sadly, some children cannot help themselves and cannot resist the temptation to use them as skates during recess and lunch breaks as well as before and after school as they enter and leave the school grounds. It is best for everyone for children not to wear skate shoes at school. **On this basis, if you allow your child to wear skate shoes to school, they will need an alternative pair of non-skate shoes in which to change prior to entering the school grounds.**

EMERGENCY DRILL - NEXT WEEK

During next week, we will be conducting an emergency evacuation drill as we are required to do so throughout the year. These procedures can be quite confronting as all drills involve emergency warning sounds being activated and this can upset some children, particularly those in the junior grades. We will be explaining the procedures to the children to help prepare them for the occasion. You may also wish to do likewise at home.

PARENTS SMOKING OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL GATE

As of late, parents have been seen smoking just outside the school gates whilst dropping off and waiting to pick their child/ren up from school. Please refrain from doing so for obvious reasons, most importantly for everyone's health and safety.

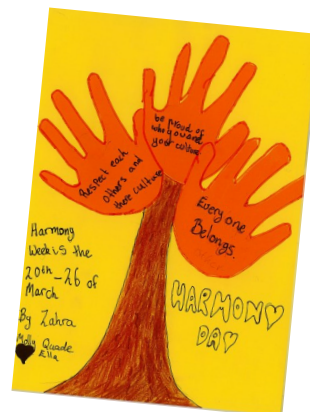
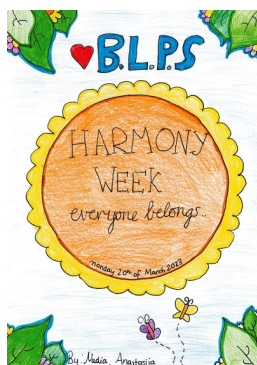

NAPLAN

A reminder that our grade 3 and grade 5 students will be participating in the NAPLAN tests next week, starting on Wednesday 15th March. Our testing days are spread out over the two weeks with grade 3 and grade 5 completing the Writing test on Wednesday 15th March. The grade 3 writing test is on paper, with all other tests completed online for grade 3 and grade 5. Our grade 5 students will complete their Conventions of Language, Reading and Numeracy tests by Thursday 16th March. Our grade 3 students will complete their Conventions of Language, Reading and Numeracy tests by Monday 20th March with catch up tests scheduled during the testing weeks.

We emphasize a "try your best" attitude towards NAPLAN, being mindful that we are providing a clear message that we are proud of the effort the students put in, more than the outcome. Please speak with the class teacher if you are concerned about your child completing Naplan or if your child is experiencing anxiety prior to the test, so we can provide additional reassurance.

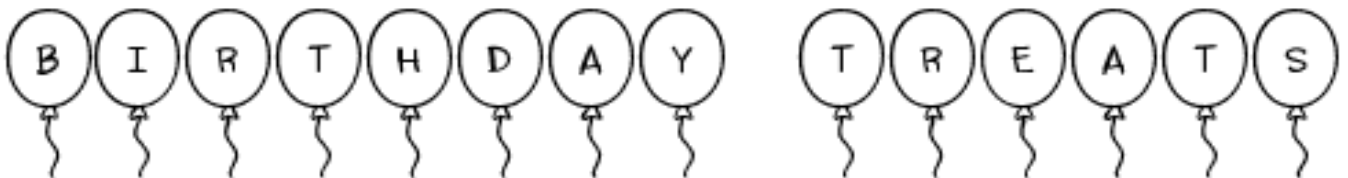

BOOK CLUB ISSUE 2 IS OUT NOW!

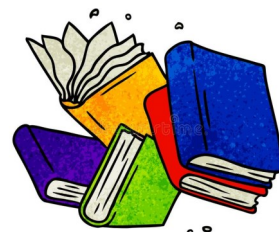

CANTEEN ONLINE ORDERING SYSTEM



Berwick Lodge canteen LUNCH ordering system called Qkr (pronounced Quicker) is available for canteen lunch orders

Qkr by MasterCard can be downloaded for **FREE** from Apple's App store for iPhones, iPhone app for iPads, or from Google Play for Android phones and tablets.

What families need to do TO SET UP ORDERING:

- Download the Qkr App to your phone or tablet.
 - Register
 - Find our School: Berwick Lodge P.S (from "Nearby Locations")
 - Register your child/ren – Select Student Profile
 - Order Meals (you can change, cancel or repeat orders)
 - Make Payment: Up to 5 cards can be linked.
- **To CANCEL an order:** Open the QKR app and tap Activity, scroll to order history, tap the red circle with the minus symbol to cancel. Cancelling needs to be done prior to close off at 9.00am for that day.

NO COST TO DOWNLOAD THE APP!!

NO FEES, NO ACCOUNTS, you pay as you go for food only!!

- Online orders must be placed / or cancelled by 9.00am, as the online order system will close shortly after.
- Orders can be placed online up to 2 weeks ahead.
- Make sure you link your child with the correct year level and home group.

NAPLAN

Information for parents and carers

2023

Why do students do NAPLAN?

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Schools have transitioned from paper-based to computer-based assessments. All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

Online NAPLAN tests provide more precise results and are more engaging for students. One of the main benefits is tailored (or adaptive) testing, where the test presents questions which may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum.

Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics.

All government and non-government education authorities contribute to the development of NAPLAN test materials.

Participation in NAPLAN

NAPLAN is for everyone. ACARA supports inclusive testing so all students have the opportunity to participate in the national assessment program.

Adjustments are available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs.

Schools should work with parents/carers and students to identify, on a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments required for individual students with disability to access NAPLAN. Adjustments should reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments.

To help inform these decisions, you may consult the [NAPLAN public demonstration site](#), the [Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN](#), or our [series of videos](#) where parents/carers, teachers and students share their experiences in using NAPLAN adjustments.

In exceptional circumstances, a student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on adjustments for students with disability or the process required to gain a formal exemption.

What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

What if my school is closed on NAPLAN days?

Schools with compelling reasons may be given permission to schedule tests after the 9-day test window.

What can I do to support my child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some familiarisation and explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

NAPLAN timetable

The NAPLAN test window is 9 days. This is to accommodate schools that may have fewer devices.

The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 15 March and finishes on Monday 27 March 2023. Schools are advised to schedule the tests as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week.

How is my child's performance reported?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. This scale indicates whether the student is meeting expectations for the literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students and parents/carers may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help identify students who need greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas of need to improve teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review the effectiveness of programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see information about the performance of schools over time at myschool.edu.au.

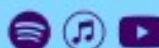

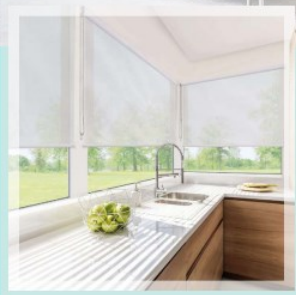
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
