# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

**Q. Why is Berwick Lodge Primary School allowed to take out of zone enrolments, when other schools are not?**

**A.** I have spoken to this question recently. Given that it has popped up again, I will have another go. We have an enrolment cap of 620 students. Our designated enrolment catchment zone provides approximately 30 per cent of that total. Given that we have 25 classrooms in total, we can adequately cater for up to 620 students. The Department of Education have indicated that we would not be provided with any further transportable classrooms to accommodate total student numbers above 620 students if this were caused by enrolling students from outside our designated enrolment zone. Hence, we can enrol students from outside our enrolment zone currently, up to the school total of 620. Of course, all students who live within our enrolment zone, are guaranteed a place at our school.

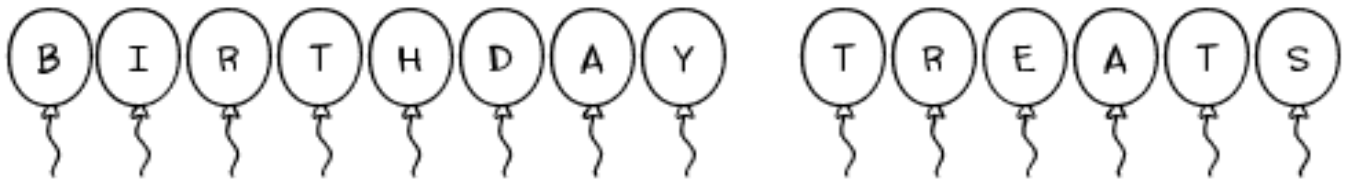


# CANTEEN NEWS

## Detox your Home is coming to Berwick!

Saturday 24 June 2023

Safely dispose of unwanted household chemicals at a free Detox your Home event, without harming your health or the environment.

Household chemicals such as bleach, pesticides, weed killers, cleaning products, cosmetics, and cooking oil should never be put in your rubbish bins or poured down the drain.

Detox your Home events are drive-through and contactless.

### Why dispose of household chemicals?

Household chemicals can be dangerous. They may harm your family and pets, add extra fuel to a house fire, release toxic fumes and pollute the environment.

Disposing of these items responsibly will:

- reduce the risk of poisoning, keeping your family, friends and pets safe
- keep toxic chemicals out of waterways, and
- minimise environmental pollution and fire hazards.

### What happens to the chemicals?

Qualified chemists sort the chemicals, placing them in sealed drums to be transported to a specialist waste treatment plant. The majority of chemicals collected at Detox your Home events are recycled or used for suitable purposes, such as producing energy. Any chemicals that cannot be repurposed are safely disposed of after being treated.
