FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

A. That is the plan, but of course, I cannot guarantee that. All class teachers have, as I said in my earlier email to parents on our staffing update, prepared draft arrangements for grade splits. In doing this they have grouped children with classmates with whom they work well and are on friendly terms. Nonetheless, on any given day, children are absent from school too and it may be that their "friend" in their group is not at school. Also, groups may need to be altered on any given day to balance group numbers due to student absences in the grade affecting the balance in any one group. It is also worth noting that flexibility and adaptability to changing situations are valuable life skills to possess. Having children adapt well to a new set of circumstances rather than always changing things to pre-empt and/or prevent any "discomfort" (for want of a better word) has a place.

Over the last few days, many grades have been planting in the garden with Mrs McCrum. It's been wonderful to see them having fun planting some winter vegies.






















2024 ENROLMENTS




The school canteen is open every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Detox your Home is coming to Berwick!

Safely dispose of unwanted household chemicals at a free Detox your Home event, without harming your health or the environment.

Household chemicals such as bleach, pesticides, weed killers, cleaning products, cosmetics, and cooking oil should never be put in your rubbish bins or poured down the drain.

Detox your Home events are drive-through and contactless.

Why dispose of household chemicals?

Household chemicals can be dangerous. They may harm your family and pets, add extra fuel to a house fire, release toxic fumes and pollute the environment.

Disposing of these items responsibly will:

- reduce the risk of poisoning, keeping your family, friends and pets safe
- keep toxic chemicals out of waterways, and
- minimise environmental pollution and fire hazards.

What happens to the chemicals?

Qualified chemists sort the chemicals, placing them in sealed drums to be transported to a specialist waste treatment plant. The majority of chemicals collected at Detox your Home events are recycled or used for suitable purposes, such as producing energy. Any chemicals that cannot be repurposed are safely disposed of after being treated.



Detox your Home accepts:




