WELCOME BACK



CITY OF CASEY SAFE AROUND SCHOOLS

We are currently working with the City of Casey to collaborate and educate our community, families and students about how we can make it safer around our school, particularly when traveling to and from school in the mornings and afternoons. Included in the newsletter is some information about the program. All families will also receive via an email, a booklet from the City of Casey with further information to read and share with their families. Our students will participate in an incursion in a few weeks time to learn about safely coming to and leaving school, including when walking, riding a bicycle or traveling by car. The City of Casey will have a presence over the next 8 weeks, particularly in the mornings and afternoons, talking with parents about concerns, safe movement of traffic and how we can keep everyone safe. The local Police will also be on patrol around our school roads, working with drivers to educate about safe road usage. Our local families have also received a survey from the City of Casey to provide feedback about our local neighbourhood traffic and roads. NAIDOC Week in Performing Arts



This week in Performing Arts we have been learning a traditional Torres Strait Islander Song: **Sesere Eeye.** One possible meaning of the song is about a Kingfisher bird that dives into the water and back out again catching a fish.

The Prep students learned the song with some simple actions.

The Grade 1 and 2 students learned the song with actions and then added some simple percussion instruments.

The Grade 3 and 4 students learned the song and traditional dance. They then played simple ukulelue chords to accompany the song.

The Grade 5 and 6 students learned the song and dance moves. In small groups they then created a unique dance or musical arrangement (using ukulele and percussion) to accompany the song.

NAIDOC Week in Visual Arts


This week in Visual Arts the Preps read the Rainbow Serpent with Mrs Zammit and then used acrylic paints in warm and cool colours to fingerpaint scales for a large collaborative Rainbow Serpent.

Grade 2 students are creating their own Indigenous Rainstick and began with designing lovely patterns for their cap ends using paint pens.

Some Grade 3 /4 students have used patterns and zentagles to fill Australian animals using black fineliners.

Grade 6 students looked at the NAIDOC website to look at past and present posters for inspiration, as well as Aboriginal symbols to begin creating a cardboard sculpture that will fit together with different designs.







THE 'ALMOST' IMPOSSIBLE SHOT

This term we have introduced the 'almost' impossible shot to all the students in the school as a novelty challenge. The aim of the challenge is to throw the tennis ball in the tube on the full from a certain distance. Each year level has a beginning distance to try and accomplish.

Prep- Im

Grade I- I.5m

Grade 2 - 2m

Grade 3 - 2.5m

Grade 4 - 3m

Grade 5 - 3.5m

Grade 6 - 4m

If a student accomplishes their goal distance for their year level, their name goes on the honour board in the gymnasium and the new distance is increased by 0.5m. The student with their name at the end of the year with the longest distance accomplished will receive a little trophy to honour their achievement. These distances will then be recorded and will be the starting distance for each level in 2024.

Congratulations to Aleyna in 5B who achieved the 3.5m distance this week. She has now set the record for this year level and the new distance for grade 5 is 4m!

Students have had the opportunity to experience the 'almost' impossible shot during P.E lessons this week. I know a lot of students have loved the concept and we look forward to offering opportunities for students to have a go during recess/lunchtime sessions and assemblies as well. Maybe also the teachers can join in and have their own little competition too.

We will be sure to inform you of students that accomplish the challenge and the new records set!! Thank you to Mrs Whitelaw for her handy work in making and introducing the concept.




LOST AND FOUND

COMMONIVY NEWS



Getting children to school safely is everyone's job.

Too many cars around schools at drop-off & pick-up times can make it more dangerous for children and hard to find a parking spot.

We can all work together to get everyone to school safely and on time.



Reduce car trips – one of these options may work for you

- Walk or ride to school.
- If your school has a Walk to School map, get a copy from the office.
- Park and walk. Park a little further away from school and enjoy a short walk avoiding traffic and parking pressure.
- Carpool with a friend. You can share the pick-up and drop-off with another parent.



Keep the Drop off Pick up Zone moving

- A Drop off Pick up Zone is a special place to quickly drop-off or pick-up your child when you use your car. You can only stay in the zone for 2 minutes each time and you must stay with your car.
- Move as far down the Drop off Pick up Zone as possible, don't stop at the start, this blocks the traffic behind you.
- Arrive at least three minutes after the school bell. No children are ready before this time. Don't arrive early and park in the Pick up Zone – remember, you can only stop here for 2 minutes.
- Change your pick-up or drop-off times to avoid the busiest peak times.
 - For example: in the afternoon, arrive 5 minutes after the bell to pick-up your child and avoid the busy time.
- Child not there? Keep moving! Drive out of the zone and come back, don't park and wait for them.





No Parking

This no parking sign means that the area is a Drop off Pick up Zone. You cannot leave your vehicle unattended and you cannot stop for more than two minutes. The times may be a little different at your school, but the rules are the same. Fines can apply if the signs are not followed.

COMMONITY NEWS

Be courteous and aware

- Follow signs, road rules and parking signs. They are there to keep our children safe.
- No stopping signs mean "Do not stop your vehicle for any reason". These areas must be kept clear for pedestrians and motorists.
- Do not park on nature strips or in front of driveways. This is very dangerous for children and other road users.
- Do not drop your children on the other side of the road and tell them to run across. Use a Drop off Pick up Zone or the safest crossing point, like a School Crossing or Pedestrian Crossing.
- Be extra careful and patient around schools.
- Slow down and be alert! Children can be unpredictable. Remain careful, especially at the busy morning and afternoon school times.

Use school crossings

- Casey's School Crossing Supervisors are trained to help children to cross the road safely.
- Use the school crossing. It is the safest place for children to cross the road.
- Keep the school crossing clear. Do not stop your car on the crossing. It is dangerous and illegal to block the crossing.



GETTING CHILDREN TO SCHOOL SAFELY IS EVERYONE'S JOB. Think before you park, drive, drop off and pick up. All children deserve to get to school safely.

Follow the signs And keep children safe



School Zone

The speed limit around schools is 40km on school days between 8.00am and 9.30am and 2.30pm and 4.00pm.

Slow down and keep children safe.



No Stopping

The no stopping sign means you cannot stop your vehicle for any purpose, no matter how short the time.





Bus Zone

A bus zone is an area only for buses. You cannot stop there at all.
