PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

We celebrated Book week at Monday's school assembly. My contribution to the celebration was to make a guest appearance, in costume, as **'Professor T. Twister'** – author of tongue twister children's books. Photos are attached to this newsletter! In recent weeks (as Mr Grossek) I have been visiting classrooms across our school and during these 45-minute sessions, some time has been spent on reciting tongue twisters with the children. Whilst there is a huge element of fun associated with repeating tongue twisters at speed, there are, as research demonstrates also valuable speech skills being developed. We had a lot of fun at our assembly and most children are thoroughly convinced that Professor T. Twister is in fact Mr Grossek!

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

GUIDELINES FOR COVID SYMPTOMS

The DET Guidelines for managing situations in which children and/or staff present with Covid-like symptoms remain unchanged. Consequently, when children present with such symptoms, our admin staff will contact parents to collect their child and to remain home until they have no symptoms, unless a doctor's medical clearance is provided.

EVACUATION FIRE DRILL

Today's evacuation fire drill ran very smoothly with all the children appearing to take the exercise in their stride. Thank you for your support in reassuring your child (where this was necessary) that the drill was a practice and there was nothing to worry about.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What can we do to support our children in safe and appropriate use of social media platforms?

A. It is good question and one for which solutions require a great deal of patience and vigilance. Obviously, the starting point is discussion with your children. Having clear rules and guidelines in place, preferably with some input from your child however you approach that. Regular monitoring of your children's use of social media is also most important. At best, not allowing your children to have access to sites not recommended for their age group. I acknowledge the challenge it is to ensure that all children are being adequately supervised and using social media platforms in accord with guidelines. In some ways, "the horse has bolted" in the use of social media by children and this is also very frustrating for us at school, because following up on out-of-school social media (mis) behaviour by students, some of whom no longer attend any school, is very time-consuming and can be stressful for all involved. Nonetheless, it is what we all do in the best interests of the children.














2024 ENROLMENTS

Do you have any clothing that your child may have borrowed from sickbay?


If so, can you please wash and return these items as soon as possible.

Dear Berwick Lodge Parents & Carers, To keep all students & pedestrians safe, please follow these rules around your school precinct.

- The staff carpark is for staff only. Do not park or drop off children in this area. It is out-of-bounds for students & families.
- The Reserve next to the school provides over 80 car spaces for families to use, including disability parks. As a driver, always look for pedestrians when entering and exiting this Reserve and keep to the speed limit.
- <u>Always</u> use the school crossing. Your School Crossing supervisors Darryl and Lisa are there to keep all pedestrians safe.
- When using the Drop off Pick up Zone, please ensure children enter and exit from the safety door (footpath side) and that you only stay in the Zone for 2 minutes during the specified time. Move to the front of the zone at all times to allow traffic to flow.
- On Collins Ave, please do not double park if the Drop off Pick up Zone is full – this is dangerous for all children. Keep driving and come back when Zone is empty.
- Please follow all signs and keep to 40km around the school precinct.


