PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

PARENT HELPERS FOR EXCURSIONS & CAMPS

We really need your assistance – we always have, but now more so than ever. We have noticed a decline in the number of parents who volunteer to assist with attending excursions or camps. The situation regarding camps is critical because with the introduction of Time in Lieu provisions, we are restricted in the number of staff we can allocate to attend, beyond the minimum ratios required. Insofar as excursions are concerned, on any given day, we are quite likely to have teachers absent for whom our teacher replacement agencies cannot provide us with replacements. This impacts on our capacity for flexibility with staff and increases the need for parents to attend. If you are at all able to assist us when your child has an excursion/camp, please contact our office staff and/or complete the request form that we send out to families.

It is that time of the year again when our attention turns to include a focus on grade planning for the next year. You would have received an email this week asking to inform us if your child will not be returning in 2024 or if you have a sibling child starting Prep next year.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

SOME REALLY GOOD NEWS

Earlier this week we received official notification that the Department of Education will continue to provide funding to all government schools or the next 2 years to continue the Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI). This will enable us to provide additional teaching and learning support for children who have been on the program to date.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. When will we know who will be our children's teachers next year?

A. That will happen towards the end of the year – most likely in early December. Currently we have begun the process of filling teaching vacancies for next year. This process could stretch out to the end of October, or even later, depending on the availability of suitable teachers whom we can employ. There is also always the possibility of an unforeseen change of circumstance for existing staff at any point in time – with the obvious impact on staffing certainty.



If so, can you please wash and return these items as soon as possible.




CANTEEN NEWS
