SUNSMART

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Berwick Lodge is a registered Sun Smart school. We are committed to ensuring our students are protected from too much UV. Sun Smart recommends SPF30 or higher broad-spectrum,

water-resistant sunscreen be applied to any skin not covered by clothing. Teachers do not apply sunscreen for students, but we do support strategies to help remind students to apply sunscreen \star themselves before heading outdoors. Please help support this message at home by:

- Supplying your child with SPF30 or higher, broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen for use during school hours
- Talk to your child about the importance of using sunscreen regularly to help prevent skin damage and skin cancer
- Ensure your child knows how to apply their sunscreen independently and has had some practise so they will be all set to apply it safely at school
- Be a Sun Smart role model at home with sunscreen, hats, clothing, shade and sunglasses

🛧 RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

This term, students from Prep to grade 6 will be learning about Topic 7 - Gender and Identity and Topic 8 - Positive Gender Relations as a part of the Respectful Relationships curriculum. The Respectful Relationships curriculum is **mandated** by the Victorian Department of Education and imes Training for all students from Prep to Year 10 and covers units focusing on Social and Emotional \star wellbeing through to Positive Gender Relations. The units being covered in term 4 are designed to + educate our students and develop an understanding of gender based violence, and learn about the influence of gender norms on attitudes and behaviours. There is a great deal of information about the value of educating our students from an early age about gender equality, correctly naming body parts and protective behaviours.

 \star Respectful Relationships from Prep to Grade 6, will teach students to correctly name body parts, \star learn strategies such as NO, GO, TELL, explore gender identity, challenge stereotypes, and to value \star and show respect for diversity and difference, and how to apply these attitudes within relationships. $\frac{1}{2}$ We encourage all families to talk to their child about what they are learning at school and together with a whole school and community approach we can work towards respectful relationships for \bigstar everyone. \bigstar



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


If any of these items belong to you, please come to the office for collection.

We understand that finding time to take your child to see the dentist can be very hard and time consuming, which is why we provide the service of having dentistry coming to you. Your child will receive quality dental treatment from our highly trained and professional dental team, all of whom are working with children certified.

We will also provide information to your child about the importance of maintaining great oral health, and we will ensure your child loves coming back to the dentist.

Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS)

With assistance from the Government, Medicare has introduced a Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS) that provides children access to basic dental services from the ages of 2-17 years old. The entitlement is capped at \$1,052 per child for every two calendar year period.

To be eligible, you or the child must be claiming one of the following benefits: Family Tax Benefits-Part A, Parenting Payment, Abstudy, Youth Allowance, Carer's Payment, Disability Support Pension, Special Benefits or Double Orphan Pension. To enquire if your child is eligible, please contact Medicare on 132 011.

Once your child's forms have been returned to your school and received by us, we will individually check each child's eligibility to see if treatment can be bulk billed through Medicare.

If your child is **not eligible** for the CDBS funding, Teeth On Wheels can offer a special deal that is only available through your school for a check-up, clean and fluoride treatment (and x-rays if required) for only **(**99 (pre-payment required) which can be up to 30% cheaper then a private practice.

Our service also provides children to be seen under **Private Health Insurance**, as most providers will offer two free check-ups' and clean per family member each calendar year. To make a claim, you pay \$99 to Teeth On Wheels and we will provide you with an invoice to claim your treatment back through your Private Health Fund.



Spring is here, Melbourne weather is improving - Let's get Active!

As October is fast approaching, it is time to think about how your school can Get Active! There are so many opportunities to start Term 4 with activities to promote and increase Active Travel among your students and families.

Historically, Walk to School was a major focus in October and now it is promoted all year round. However, with the improvement of our Melbourne weather over Term 4, we really encourage families to increase their Active Travel to and from school during October and leading into the warmer months ahead.

The key messages for families are:

- · It doesn't have to be everyday even just once a week will make a difference.
- Part of the way is OK!

In this newsletter, we have put together some helpful links that can assist you to share the active travel messages with families at your school.





During the month of October, the Safe Around Schools Team will provide weekly communication to all 97 schools in Casey on various Active Travel messages which you can easily share with your families.


