ACTING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

GRADE STRUCTURE FOR 2024

This is a very exciting time of the year as we are forward planning for 2024. We will have 22 grades next year, a decrease from 25 due to a slight decline in enrolments from 2023. Some families are leaving us to move to new areas for work and/or family reasons and we wish them all the best. Our local kindergartens have also had less enrolments this year, hence only having 3 Prep classes next year. Due to our student numbers in 2024, we will have largely straight classes and three composite classes. We have had composite classes before, and our highly skilled teachers capably plan the curriculum programs for these children as they do when teaching a straight grade. All children across the school will be taught the appropriate curriculum for their level of schooling. Our 5 specialist programs next year will be: Performing Arts, Visual Arts, Lote – Mandarin, Physical Education, and the return of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics).

Our grade structure for next year is as follows:

Grade Prep (Foundation) - 3 classes

Grade One – 3 classes

Grade Two – 3 classes

Grade One/Two – I class

Grade Three – 2 classes

Grade Four – 2 classes

Grade Three/Four - 2 classes

Grade Five – 3 classes Grade Six – 3 classes

Total: 22 Grades.






CANTEEN NEWS





Active Travel – How to fit a helmet safely.

As a community, we always love seeing children being active by riding, scooting, or skating in our neighborhood.

It is important your child always wears a helmet while on a bike, scooter, or skateboard to ensure they are not seriously injured. Wearing a helmet reduces the risk of head injuries by up to 74%.

Here is the correct way to fasten your helmet.



- Ensure your child's helmet is approved and carries the Australian standard AS/NZS 2063, which means it has been safety approved, legal and meets standards.
- When helmet is on ensure the helmet sits 2 fingers widths above the eyebrows
- Helmet straps must be correctly adjusted with no twists. The straps should form a V shape around the ears – see picture.
- Once the buckle is fastened, ensure you can place 2 fingers under the chin strap.
- If the helmet moves out of position easily, then your helmet is too loose and must be adjusted – either your straps are too loose, or your helmet is not the correct size.



Helmets must be worn when riding:

- On roads and road-related areas
- On bike or shared paths in bike lanes
- In recreational parks
- In carparks
- On footpaths
