**Kerry Worthington:** As a Numeracy Learning Specialist at BLPS, I work closely with our BLPS community to enhance teaching and learning, with a specific focus on Numeracy. My role gives me the opportunity to collaborate with teachers and provide mentoring and coaching opportunities to support classroom practice and improve student growth and learning.

**Rob Kelly:** As a STEM/Digital Technology Learning Specialist at BLPS, I have taught hundreds of students across the school, been a long-time member our school council, curriculum and leadership teams and co-developed an AR capable book.. I possesses a deep-rooted passion for Digital Technologies and STEM education. My passion extends beyond mere instruction; as a learning specialist, I am committed to fostering an environment where students not only grasp STEM concepts but also develop critical thinking skills essential for their future endeavours. By engaging students in hands-on STEM activities, I aim to instil in our students a sense off curiosity and a drive for exploration. Through STEM education, students learn to approach problems analytically, collaborate effectively, and adapt to new situations—a skill set invaluable in both their academic journey and future careers.

Lia Whitelaw: As a Literacy Learning Specialist, I work collaboratively with the principal class and staff to develop and improve the Literacy skills of students at Berwick Lodge. My responsibilities include overseeing the implementation and development of our Literacy programs (listed below), as well as coaching and supporting staff to create a literacy-rich environment where students have the skills to succeed. Literacy Programs: Spelling: Smart Spelling, Smart Foundation. Writing: VCOP, Seven Steps, Reading: Fountas and Pinnell, Cars and Stars, and Bug Club.

#### **SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2024**

Our annual school council elections are now due, and the process must be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> March. This year we have 4 parent representatives whose term of office ends - **Michelle Thompson, Mel Dobric, Brendan Pekjovic and Rajkeerat Sethi.** We also have (1) staff representative whose term of office concludes - **Angela Maskery**. Our PFA co-optee position on council is filled on an annual basis.

All above retiring school councillors, other than those who no longer have children at our school, or who no longer work at the school are eligible to seek re-election in the forthcoming elections. All vacancies are for 2-year terms.

Parent representatives - Karin Keylock, Keiren Walker and Michelle Dobbin.

### **DET representative: - Robert Kelly and Sandra McCrum**

I have included the details of eligibility requirements, the process and timeline for our elections and the obligations of school councillors and the vacancies below. All parents are most welcome to nominate for the parent category vacancies and staff are eligible to nominate for the DET representative category vacancy.

NB: The principal is always the Ex-Officio member of council.

As the Returning Officer for school council elections, I will be conducting the election process over the coming month.

Parent Representative Vacancies: Four (4) vacancies, each for a 2-year term

<u>DET Representative Vacancies:</u> One (I) vacancy, for a 2-year term.

### ACTING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS PROCESS 2024**

As the Returning Officer for School Council, I am now inviting nominations from parents for the **(4)** two-year vacancies we have for the Parent Category and from staff for the **(I)** two-year vacancy we have for the DET Category.

Council meets 8 times per year on Monday evenings, with meetings being conducted between 6.00pm and 7.30pm at the school. It is expected that school councillors will join one of our three subcommittees, which also meet 8 times per year at a time suitable to subcommittee members. Importantly, subcommittee membership is also open to parents and staff who are not on school council, so you can become involved with the work of school council via subcommittee membership if you do not have the time to commit to school council participation at the moment.

#### **SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTION TIMELINE 2024**

Friday 16th February 2024 at 9.00am - Nominations Open

Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2024 at 4.00pm – Nominations Close

Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2024 at 4.00pm – Ballot Closes (if required)

In the event that we do not receive sufficient nominations in both categories by the close of nominations on Friday 23rd February 2024 at 4.00pm, then I will extend the timeline for receiving further nominations by one week.

Should we receive more nominations than vacancies in either or both categories, then a formal election ballot will be conducted with all parents having the opportunity to vote for the Parent Category nominations and/or staff having the opportunity to vote for the Staff (DET) Category nominations.

In the event that I receive exactly the number of nominations in either or both categories, then I will declare those nominated persons duly elected on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2024.

Please note that you can self-nominate or have other members of the category of which you are a member, nominate you. Nomination forms will be available on our parent portal on Compass, under School Documents, Parent Resources, from 9.00am tomorrow morning. Retiring staff (DET) members are eligible to be re-elected if they continue to work for a minimum of 8 hours per week for the Department of Education & Training (DET).

### SAFE AROUND SCHOOLS


#### 40km Speed Zones

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 School speed zones are reduced-speed areas that operate near schools. They're designed to keep kids safe by lowering the speed limit at peak times when children are travelling to and from school.

#### School Crossings are the safest place to cross the road.

Not all schools have school crossings located outside their school, however there maybe school crossings on your journey to school, as either a pedestrian or a driver.

Casey School Crossing Supervisors are trained to help children cross the road safely. Always listen to the supervisors' instructions. As a driver always keep the school crossing clear.

### **RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS:**

During our respectful relationship topics this term, across the school students will be developing their understanding of emotional literacy and personal strengths. Emotional literacy can be defined as the ability to understand ourselves and other people. It includes the ability to understand, express and manage our own emotions, build empathy, and to respond appropriately to the emotions of others.

Building a large vocabulary for emotions helps to increase emotional literacy and build self-awareness and and empathy for others.

Children and young people need a vocabulary to help them recognise and understand strengths and positive qualities in themselves and others. This topic provides learning activities to build this vocabulary and to use it when discussing personal, social, and ethical challenges. Research in the field of positive psychology emphasises the importance of identifying and using individual strengths. Social and emotional learning programs which use strength-based approaches promote student wellbeing, positive behaviour and academic achievement.

Qkr by MasterCard can be downloaded for **FREE** from Apple's App store for iPhones, iPhone app for IPads, or from Google Play for Android phones and tablets.

### What families need to do TO SET UP ORDERING:

- · Download the Qkr App to your phone or tablet.
  - Register
  - Find our School: Berwick Lodge P.S (from "Nearby Locations")
  - o Register your child/ren Select Student Profile
  - o Order Meals (you can change, cancel or repeat orders)
  - o Make Payment: Up to 5 cards can be linked.
- To CANCEL an order: Open the QKR app and tap Activity, scroll to order history, tap the red circle with the minus symbol to cancel. Cancelling needs to be done prior to close off at 9.00am for that day.


