ACTING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION (CSEF) INFORMATION

Please be advised that CSEF Applications for 2024 are now open.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. If you applied for the CSEF in 2023, you <u>do not</u> need to complete an application form in 2024 **unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.** You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

New student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2024 or you did not apply in 2023. **Changed family circumstances**; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or <u>new siblings commencing at the school in 2024</u>. If you are unsure if you need to complete a new form or have any other queries, please contact the school office.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 13th March 2024 and finishes on Monday 25 March 2024. Schools will schedule the tests as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week. Further information will be provided over the next few weeks.

PARENT HELPERS REQUIRED

Our grade 3-6 athletics day is scheduled for **Thursday 7th March**. To run this event, we require at least 8 parent helpers to assist on this day. If you are able to help, even for part of the day, please contact the office for further information.

CURRICULUM DAY – FRIDAY 8th MARCH

There is no school for our students on Friday 8th March as this is our curriculum day. At this stage, Camp Australia will be operating and if there are any changes, we will let families know. On the day our teachers will be involved in professional development focused on Literacy and Numeracy.

Assistant Principals' Report

\bigstar NAPLAN TESTING FOR YEARS 3 AND 5

 \bigstar \bigstar The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy tests for Years 3 and 5 students will be held between Wednesday 13th March to Monday 25th March. All students are encouraged to participate in NAPLAN tests. Students with special needs may qualify for special provisions $\stackrel{\scriptstyle }{\succ}$ $m \bigstar$ which reflect the support normally provided in the classroom. A formal exemption may be granted $m \bigstar$ for a student who has a significant intellectual disability or who has recently arrived in Australia and $\frac{1}{2}$ is from a non-English speaking background. While participation by all students is expected, students may be withdrawn from the testing program by their parent/carer. This is a matter for \bigstar \bigstar \star consideration by individual parents/carers. Withdrawals are intended to address issues such as \star 🐥 religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing. A formal application for exemption must be 🛧 received by the principal prior to the testing. Please have a discussion with your child's teacher if \bigstar you have any questions about NAPLAN.

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Information about the Drop Off Pick Up zone. $\frac{1}{2}$



The Drop off Pick up zone - What does this look like?

The Drop off Pick up zone is a special place to quickly drop off or pick up your child when you use your car.

Some schools have an internal school drop off area located within the arounds, whereas others are located outside the school grounds with this signage.

It is important to follow the rules in these zones, whether it is an internal or external Drop off Pick up zone.

What are the rules around an external Drop off Pick up zone?

You can only stay in this zone for 2 minutes each time and you must stay with your car.

Move as far down the drop off pick up zone as possible to allow more cars to enter the zone safely.


Arrive at least 3 minutes after the school bell children are not ready or in this zone before this time.


Do not arrive in this zone early and park - this stops this zone flowing and fines can apply.



Qkr by MasterCard can be downloaded for **FREE** from Apple's App store for iPhones, iPhone app for IPads, or from Google Play for Android phones and tablets.

What families need to do TO SET UP ORDERING:

- Download the Qkr App to your phone or tablet.
 - Register
 - Find our School: Berwick Lodge P.S (from "Nearby Locations")
 - Register your child/ren Select Student Profile
 - Order Meals (you can change, cancel or repeat orders)
 - o Make Payment: Up to 5 cards can be linked.
- To CANCEL an order: Open the QKR app and tap Activity, scroll to order history, tap the red circle with the minus symbol to cancel. Cancelling needs to be done prior to close off at 9.00am for that day.
