ASSITANT PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day. Students who are regularly absent from school are at risk of missing fundamental aspects of their educational and social development. The Victorian Governments "Everyday Counts" initiative promotes the fact that regular school attendance enables students to maximise their full potential and to actively participate and engage in their learning. It is important that children develop habits or regular attendance at an early age. Children with attendance of 80 per cent or less (that is, 40 days or more absenteeism per year) may be significantly disadvantaged in their learning. If you are having attendance issues with your child, please let your child's teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day. Our Wellbeing Assistant Principal or school staff will contact you if there are any concerns about your child's attendance or punctuality. Remember **EVERYDAY COUNTS!**

LATE ARRIVALS

Student punctuality is equally important. At the beginning of the day students are informed of the day's program, events and important instructions are often given. Students arriving late to school (after 9.00 am) also disrupt the class they are in, as they get organised and settled for the day. Your co-operation on this matter would be greatly appreciated. A student arriving late to school must sign in at the office and their late arrival will be recorded on the daily attendance roll. Parents/Guardians must provide a reason for their child arriving late to school.

ASSITANT PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

NAPLAN TESTING FOR YEARS 3 AND 5

A reminder that NAPLAN for Years 3 and 5 students will be held between Wednesday 15th March to the 24th of March. All students are encouraged to participate in NAPLAN tests. Students with special needs may qualify for special provisions which reflect the support normally provided in the classroom. A formal exemption may be granted for a student who has a significant intellectual disability or who has recently arrived in Australia and is from a non-English speaking background. While participation by all students is expected, students may be withdrawn from the testing program by their parent/carer. This is a matter for consideration by individual parents/carers. Withdrawals are intended to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing. A formal application for exemption must be received by the principal prior to the testing. Please have a discussion with your child's teacher if you have any questions about NAPLAN.

EMERGENCY DRILL - NEXT WEEK

During next week, we will be conducting an emergency evacuation drill as we are required to do so throughout the year. These procedures can be quite confronting as all drills involve emergency warning sounds being activated and this can upset some children, particularly those in the junior grades. We will be explaining the procedures to the children to help prepare them for the occasion. You may also wish to do likewise at home.

CARE OF TOILETS BY CHILDREN

We need your assistance please parents. We are experiencing a sudden spate of bad toileting behaviour by some boys and girls in both the junior and senior grades. Soiling toilets, urinating in wrong places, failing to flush toilets, and throwing wet toilet paper on the ceiling are the main ones. Then there is blocking toilets with rolls of toilet paper and locking the toilet doors. Our teachers reinforce appropriate behaviour in the toilets regularly and we will continue to be as vigilant as we can in supervising the children when using toilets, but there are privacy issues which do, quite rightly, limit us. I would be very grateful if you could speak with your children about the importance of appropriate use of their school toilets and if they are aware of any children who are not doing the right thing when using the toilets, could they please let their teacher know, in confidence.
