NEW ENROLMENTS FOR 2025

I am pleased to say that we can now accept your completed enrolment forms for new enrolments for 2025. In saying this, however, the Department of Education has made it clear to all schools that new enrolments for 2025 cannot be officially confirmed until Monday 29th July 2024. This applies to all new enrolments irrespective of whether your child lives within the designated school's enrolment zone or not. All schools are required to adhere to this directive. Our school is in the position to accept enrolments from outside our designated zone because our zone is relatively small in terms of primary school age children, and we have substantial enrolment space annually within our enrolment ceiling of 620 students in total. If you have a child starting prep next year, please contact the school on 9709 6700 and our office team will assist you with the enrolment process.
