PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

LATE ARRIVALS

The number of children arriving late to school in the morning has significantly increased this term. Hopefully this will ease off as we progress through the term. Importantly, all children arriving late must report to the main office sign in before going to their classrooms.

LUNCHTIME EATING ARRANGEMENTS

Earlier this week I announced to all classes that we are making changes to lunchtime eating arrangements for the children. In future, children will be required to eat their lunches in their classrooms, with teachers extending the time that children can eat their lunch if necessary. This will be done by starting to eat their lunch a little earlier than 12.42pm as required. Some children do take quite a bit longer to complete eating their lunch and they will be able to finish their lunch outside their classrooms before moving off to play.

There are several reasons for this change. Firstly, some children do not eat their lunch when they take it outside they simply throw it in the bins or on the ground. Many children who take their lunch boxes outside put them down somewhere and they get 'lost'. I understand that in term 4 of last year and term 1 of this year, the school received a significant number of calls from parents expressing concern over their child's 'lost' lunch box. It has been suggested that we place a large container outside every classroom with the plan being that children can then deposit their empty lunch box in the container and then collect it after lunch. That would cause confusion in cases where children have the same looking lunch box. Experience also tells us that for more than a few children they will simply forget to do so in the moment and will do as they have been doing to date and that is to simply leave their lunch box at the place where they finish eating, then run off and play with their friends.

Another matter of concern to us is the provision of metal forks with lunches for some children. Recently we had an incident which involved a child brandishing a fork in a potentially worrying manner, having found it in the playground during lunchtime. I have collected about a half a dozen forks after lunch from the school grounds just last week. Banning forks from being taken outside is, in my opinion, a valuable preventative measure.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

On another related note, despite our repeated educational and advisory programs and messages to the children, I am disappointed to note that the amount of lunchtime and canteen litter dropped by the children in the playgrounds has not reduced over time. For many years now I have been supervising litter pick up in our playgrounds on a regular basis every week. On my return I have noted that the situation has not improved.

Thank you to those parents who have taken the time to forward me their concerns over the new lunch time eating policy and I hope this clarifies matters for you.

CHILDREN PRESENTING AS ILL TO SICKBAY

Please note, we are still following COVID guidelines with respect to children reporting to sick bay and displaying Covid-like symptoms.

CHILDREN'S LOST PROPERTY

This also concerns me. Every day a substantial number of school clothing items end up in our lost property bin, with children having simply left them in the school grounds wherever they took them off. Unfortunately, a lot of such clothing does not have any form of name tag attached or printed on the clothing and we can't identify the owner. By the end of every term, we have literally many bags full of children's lost clothing – none of which have any name tag ID. Please take the time to attach a name tag or written ID on your children's clothing item that they may take off at school.

We will be conducting our Professional Practice Day (PUPIL-FREE) on Friday 7 June. Please make alternative arrangements for the supervision of your child/ren on this day.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

Q. Why is our school uniform optional?

A. When our school opened in 1990, our inaugural school council made this decision on the basis that they strongly felt that, whilst the wearing of school uniform was highly desirable, making it compulsory would have the potential for it becoming a punitive measure with no contribution to our learning programs. Twice since then we have surveyed our parent body on the issue and both times a clear majority of parents were in support of the existing policy. In fact, almost all children do wear the school uniform every day without it creating other issues.

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ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY.

Next week, the grade 4, 5 and 6 students will complete the Student Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS). This survey is administered to all government school students in Years 4 to 12.

The AtoSS is a voluntary annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools and the department to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and will be asking your child about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

Parents/carers can opt their child out, if they would prefer not to participate, please inform the school on Monday 6th May at the latest.

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WALK SAFELY TO SCHOOL DAY

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Friday 10th May 2024 is Walk Safely to School Day (WSTSD) is an annual, national event when all primary school children are encouraged to walk and commute safely to school. It is a community event seeking to promote road safety, health, public transport and the environment. **WSTSD** promotes the important message that active kids are healthy kids. The event encourages parents, carers and their children to build regular walking to and from school into their daily routine. Children need a minimum of 60 minutes exercise per day. Encouraging less driving and more walking aims to decrease dangerous vehicle congestion around schools and reduce carbon emissions from idling cars. Lastly, it is just a nice way to be part of your community. The Junior School Council have been busy planning some activities to promote this message. **On Friday 10th May** we are asking students to come to school in sensible **Active Wear**, for example runners and tracksuit, or sports top and shorts etc.

★ ROAD SAFETY


In the light of Walk Safely to School Day please use this as an opportunity to discuss road safety with your children. Your child still needs adult supervision and assistance in the traffic environment. It is important to:

- Talk together about signs and traffic lights. Identify and discuss places where it is safe to cross the road.
- Teach your child how to crossroads using the 'stop, look, listen and think'
 process stop at the kerb, look, and listen for traffic and then decide whether it
 is safe to cross. Take the trip to school together along the safest footpaths and
 use safe crossing places, such as pedestrian crossings and on straight sections of
 road.

- Supervise your child on the way to and from school.
- Always be a good role model for your child by wearing your own seatbelt, obeying road rules, driving courteously, and crossing roads safely.
