DROP OFF AND PICK UP ZONES



This fortnight in prep land the preppies have been busy exploring teen numbers and 2D shapes, participating in PMP and having a go at applying learnt sounds when writing sentences. We also met our grade six buddies and created "Love Jars" together to find common interests to help develop connections between our buddies. Next week we will begin revising learnt sounds from our phonics program, participate in House Cross Country and practice our Easter Hat Parade songs (5)

GRADE 1/2 NEWS

Grade 2SM 1 METRE CHALLENGE







Over the last few weeks, the Grade 2 students have been having fun doing lots of different measuring activities. They have been estimating (having a guess) and then using different measuring tools to compare and find the length, capacity and mass of different objects inside and outside the classroom.

In 2SM, students were challenged to use Lego blocks, unifix cubes, plastic sticks, chalk and their arms to make 1metre towers, lines, drawings and handspans.

They then used a metre ruler to measure their creations.







ERADE 3/4 News

This term, our Grade 4 students have been exploring weathering, erosion, and deposition through our beneath our feet science unit. Students have conducted hands-on experiments by using everyday materials like noodles, sugar cubes, sand, mints, and icy pole sticks to observe how rocks break down and move in nature.


They observed weathering by knocking two pieces of noodles together, allowing them to see how rocks grind against each other over time. They also explored how tree roots can break apart rocks by gently pushing an icy pole stick through pieces of noodles. In another activity, students used mints in a cup to represent how wind and storms break down rocks, watching as the mints cracked and broke apart.

Students also observed how water affects rocks by placing sugar cubes in water and watching them dissolve, demonstrating how water can break down rocks. Lastly, they created small hills with sand and watched how water running down the hill moved broken noodle pieces, showing how water can both move and deposit materials.


These fun experiments helped students understand the natural processes that shape the Earth's surface in an engaging and interactive way.

The students are practicing how to develop interesting characters, setting, and plots to make their stories come to life. With stories ranging from robotic mutant pirates, to talking capybaras, our writers have demonstrated some fantastic creativity this past week!

HOUSE CROSS COUNTRY

A reminder that Thursday 27th March is our whole school House Cross Country day commencing at approximately 9:30am. The day is similar to the House Athletics Day where all children will be competing for their house team. Students from grades Prep-6 are familiar with the course having been training around the designated track with their class teacher.

All students (Prep-6) will be expected to compete, so please ensure that your child wears appropriate clothing and footwear for the event. All children are expected to take part in the activity with children un-able to run still encouraged to walk. Children should wear their House colours on this day as children are running for their house and a shield will be presented to the winning team.

The House Cross Country will act as selection trials for the District competition (grades 3-6) only. The <u>first 8 runners</u> in each age group will be selected for the Berwick Lodge team which will then compete at the Edwin Flack District Championships on <u>Tuesday 6th May</u>. <u>As there is no 8-9 years age group at the District Competition, I will time the first 2-3 placegetters in this age category and compare them with the 10 years to determine if any runners from this age group qualify for the District competition.</u>

Please note that cross country is a winter event and will only be cancelled if the weather is deemed unsafe to proceed. Please supply a change of clothes including a spare pair of shoes and socks as the course may be muddy. In turn, if the weather is warm, please ensure students apply sunscreen the morning of the event and bring sunscreen to apply throughout the day. It is also advisable that students bring plenty of water to keep them hydrated and to wear their hats.

Any parent helpers that have offered to help, please bring an umbrella and wear wet weather clothing if the weather looks wet.



Our grades are continuing with their Author focus books and are also looking at books to support their Inquiry topics.


