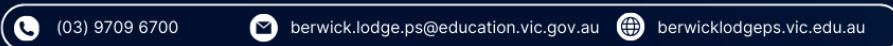

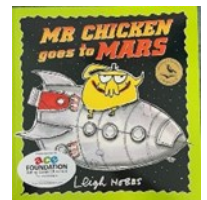

HEALTHIER HEARTS & LIGHTER MINDS



Healthier Hearts &
Lighter Minds

As part of the **Healthier Hearts Lighter Minds program**, the grade three- four students have been learning strategies to help them manage big feelings.

Every day we all experience a wide range of emotions that impact our mood and ability to get through each day. Every day can look very different. From feeling stressed when the alarm doesn't go off, being stuck in traffic, forgetting our lunch and feeling overwhelmed, our emotions can sometimes get the better of us. When that happens, our actions can sometimes spill over and impact the people around us.

The students who took part in the program learnt strategies to help them identify and manage big feelings. One powerful tool they focused on was to '**Identify, Control, Express**' a process that helps us recognise what we're feeling, manage our reactions, and express ourselves in a healthy way.

Through engaging games, role play scenarios, and discussions, students explored ways to regulate emotions and make positive choices.

The children explored **six core emotions**:

Joy- What brings you joy? With a clear, calm mind, we are more able to make good choices.

Disgust- This arises as a feeling of rejection towards something we morally or physically don't align with. This could be someone or something. If we're not careful we can project our disgust onto others and make them feel small or unworthy.

Fear- Alerts us to the possibility of danger or the threat of harm, whether that danger is physical or psychological. It's useful to understand our fears and talk about them. Sharing our feelings can help.

Sadness- Sadness is a normal part of life. Talking to someone about our sadness and finding positive outlets can help us find our way back to joy.

Anger- Might arise when things do not happen the way we would like. It's okay to feel angry. Anger can let us know when something isn't right, or a boundary has been crossed. We need to express anger in an appropriate way, not a hurtful way. Anger is okay. Aggression isn't.

Surprise- Is usually brief and an expression of something that was unexpected. Surprise often doesn't last long before evolving into another emotion.

The students learnt that our minds can feel murky when we're full of different emotions, but with the right strategies, we can make sense of them and respond in ways that are kind to ourselves and others.

Literacy

Grade 1 and 2 students have made great progress in phonics this term, focusing on long vowel sounds. We have been practicing these sounds through structured lessons and various reading and writing activities.

Students have also been creating narratives, learning to structure stories with clear beginnings, middles, and endings. They have enjoyed sharing their stories, and we're excited to see their literacy skills grow!

House Cross Country

It was a day full of energy, excitement and fun!

The children were all dressed in their house colours and gathered together to cheer each other on. They ran, jogged and even skipped through the course, making sure to enjoy every step of the race.



Mathematics



As we approach the end of the term, we want to share with you the exciting math concepts that our students in Grade 1 and Grade 2 have been exploring. We have been busy working through various engaging topics, so here is a look at what your child has been learning in mathematics.



Data Collection and Tallying:

Students have been learning to collect data and record it using tally marks. Through hands-on activities, they've been analysing and representing information to draw conclusions.

Time:

Grade 1 students have been mastering time-telling on both analogue and digital clocks, focusing on the hour and half-hour. We have used clocks and games to make learning engaging.

Place Value: Exploring Numbers

In both grades, students have been building their understanding of place value. Grade 1 students have been working with two-digit numbers, while Grade 2 students have focused on three-digit numbers, comparing, ordering and solving problems.

GRADE 3/4 NEWS

Healthy Heart and Lighter Minds Incursion

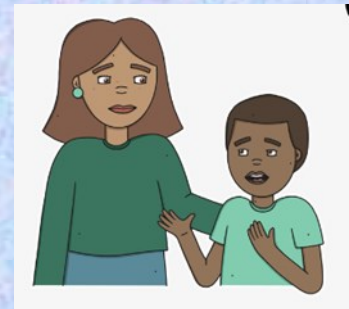
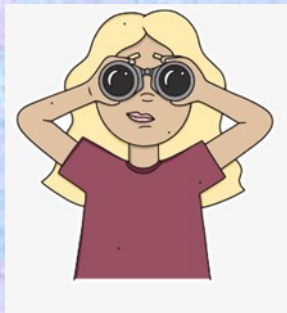
This week, the Grade 3/4 students had the wonderful opportunity to participate in the *Healthy Hearts and Lighter Minds* incursion. This incursion focused on building social and emotional literacy in primary schools.

During the session, students engaged in real-life scenarios and interactive discussions on making positive choices using the ICE strategy: **Identify, Control, and Express**.

- **Identify** - Recognise and name the emotion you're feeling.
- **Control** - Use strategies like deep breathing or mindfulness to stay calm.
- **Express** - Share your feelings in a respectful and constructive way.

By applying the ICE strategy, we can make thoughtful and responsible choices in our interactions with others. We also discussed the importance of kindness, active listening and ways we can be good friends by showing respect and understanding.

We explored 6 core emotions human's face—joy, disgust, sadness, anger, fear, and surprise—by mixing colours in water, visually representing how emotions blend and change. We also discovered strategies to clear our minds. Such as remembering joyful experiences or, finding stillness in meditation and five-finger breathing.

LIBRARY NEWS

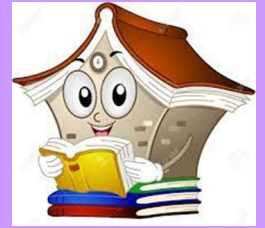
