We covered the garden bed with the tanbark. It was already looking really good. Mr Kerr and Libby layered all the tanbark flat on the garden beds. After we covered it with horse manure we had to work quickly so it didn't stink up, then Mr Kerr brought out some raspberry plants. We planted them one by one, there were 5 raspberry plants. When you walk into the Community Garden you'd see people working together to keep the garden alive, along with Mr. Kerr who helps clear the gardens to plant new ones. ### ACTING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **HELMETED HONEYEATER AMBASSADOR PROGRAM - GRADE 4**

The Helmeted Honeyeater is our school logo and we have been involved as an ambassador school with the Friends of the Helmeted Honeyeater since 2016. I first took a group of our garden club students to visit Yellingbo in 2015, planting many plants. From there the ambassador program flourished. At the end of last year, we were informed that the government had cut funding for the Environmental Education officer who ran the program. I reached out this year to the new President, Sue Bendel and she is very keen to continue the program with our school. It is wonderful that we will be able to offer this to our selected grade 4 students again this year. All grade 4 students will have the opportunity to participate in an incursion later this term to learn about the critically endangered species. Interested students can then apply to be an ambassador for 2025. The selected students then work with me and participate in 3 further excursions to Yellingbo nature reserve, the nursery and the final activity to visit Healesville Sanctuary behind the scenes to see the breeding program. Past students who have been ambassadors have loved the opportunity to learn more and share their information with our school community. I look forward to working with our ambassadors again this year.

We know that parents and carers can be juggling challenges daily to get your children to school. If your child must miss school, notify us as soon as possible so we can work together to support them.



# This week in Grade Prep

#### **Building Bridges and Big Ideas in STEM!**

This week in STEM, students across the school have been diving into the fascinating world of strong shapes and structures! From our youngest learners to our senior students, everyone took on the exciting challenge of building a bridge that could hold a toy car — without collapsing — for at least five seconds.

Our Junior School engineers worked with LEGO bricks, using their creativity and problem-solving skills to design sturdy bridges. It was fantastic to see how quickly they discovered the strength of certain shapes — especially triangles and arches — and how they could reinforce their designs for extra stability.

Meanwhile, students in the middle and senior years took on an extra layer of complexity, using only paper, straws, string, sticky tape and scissors to create their bridges. This tested not just their engineering skills but also their teamwork, patience and resilience! It was amazing to see students experimenting, adapting and learning from their mistakes — just like real engineers do.

Through this hands-on experience, students developed a deeper understanding of how strong shapes are used in real-world structures like bridges, towers and buildings. More importantly, they learned that success often comes after a few "crashes" — and that's where the best learning happens.

Congratulations to all our STEM students for their brilliant efforts, creativity and persistence. I can't wait to see what they build next!
