### ACTING PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### INCIDENT AT SCHOOL CROSSING ON MANSFIELD STREET

Yesterday we had a near miss on the Mansfield Street school crossing just before 9:00am while students and the crossing supervisor were on the crossing. A white hatch back car, driven possibly by a parent, nearly failed to stop at the crossing. I have contacted the City of Casey, and the bylaws officer will be present around our school and possibly the police as well. This is a timely reminder to not be on your phone when driving and to be very vigilant especially at pick up and drop off times. If any parents were witness to the incident or have dashcam footage, please contact me at school and/or forward this information to the police.

### Dear Parents & Carers at Berwick Lodge Primary School,

### Be a Safe Driver at School Crossings

- Drivers must approach a School Crossing at a speed slow enough to stop safely.

- Drivers must remain stopped behind the solid white line until all children and adults, including the School Crossing Supervisor are completely off the road.

- Drivers must stop if a handheld "Stop" sign is being displayed.
- Drivers should watch out for children and pedestrians near schools and always focus on the road.

# ERADE 3/4 News



### Did you know?

- The Helmeted Honeyeater is critically endangered and can only be found in small pockets of bushland in Victoria.
- It gets its name from the striking yellow 'helmet' marking on its head.
- These birds play an important role in their ecosystem by helping to pollinate native plants.

Our student ambassadors will soon be announced. They will represent our school on special excursions to Yellingbo Nature Conservation Area—home of the Helmeted Honeyeater. They will learn firsthand about conservation efforts to support our Helmeted Honey Eaters. Ambassadors will share their knowledge and experiences with the school throughout the year.

Grade 6 students have begun their term 2 Civics & Citizenship portfolio project.



#### Dragon Poat Festival Assembly – A Fun and Exciting Celebration

Some Year 6 students performed an amazing dragon and lion dance. They wore colourful costumes and moved with energy and confidence. The crowd loved it and cheered loudly!

We also enjoyed a graceful fan dance performed by some students from Years 4 to 6. They danced in time with the music and showed great teamwork. Their performance was calm, beautiful, and full of culture.

The most exciting part of the assembly was the martial arts performance, presented by visitors from the Australian East Wu Tai Chi Alliance. The performers showed strong and powerful moves. ### Year 5/6 Students Explore Chinese Art Through Lacquer Fan Incursion

As part of our Dragon Boat Festival celebrations, our Year 5 and 6 students took part in a unique and hands-on cultural experience — a Lacquer Fan incursion on June 5th. This special workshop was delivered by Mirror Arts Education, who introduced students to the traditional Chinese art of lacquer fan making.

During the session, students learned about the history and cultural meaning of lacquer fans in China. They discovered how fans were used not only to stay cool but also as symbols of beauty, elegance, and creativity. Students were fascinated to learn that fanmaking is considered a traditional art form with deep roots in Chinese culture.

The most exciting part of the incursion was when students got to design and create their own lacquer fans. Using colourful paints, marbling techniques, and a touch of creativity, each student made a one-of-a-kind fan to take home. The process was both relaxing and inspiring — a perfect mix of art, culture, and fun.

Many students said it was one of the best incursions they had ever done. It gave them a chance to express themselves artistically while learning about an important part of Chinese heritage. The activity also connected beautifully to what they have been learning in their Mandarin classes.

We would like to thank Mirror Arts Education for running such a meaningful and wellorganised workshop, and to all the staff who helped make the experience possible. 
Please make sure you bring a Library Bag to every session and don't forget to return your books on time.


