### **PLANNING WEEK**

Our planning week is an important part of each term in providing our teachers time together to plan the curriculum program for the following term. Planning week starts on Friday 27th June and concludes on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> July. Whilst our teams of teachers are working together, our specialist staff or replacement teachers take our classes on those days.

Our teachers have been very busy completing our semester one student reports which will be available to parents via COMPASS at 3.30pm on Friday 4th July. ### **ATTENDANCE**

School attendance daily is very important for student learning, connecting socially with friends and building a sense of belonging. Late arrivals after 9:00am can have a negative impact on students as they miss the vital instructions at the start of the day which can affect their learning. Even being 15 minutes late each day, equates to 75 minutes a week, 12 ½ hours a term, 50 hours or more than 7 days over the year. We understand at times, things happen, and you may be late to school but regular attendance is important for all students. If you are late, parents are required to walk their child into the office to be signed in. This is for safety reasons, so we know all students are at school. We are following up with school absences and parents who have students away need to log onto COMPASS and provide a reason. Absence letters will be sent out weekly and we request parents to enter the required information on COMPASS. Schools' attendance data is tracked by the Department of Education, and we strongly encourage parents to make this a priority for your child's learning.

### **COLLINS CRESCENT PARKING ISSUES**

A local resident has contacted the school and made a complaint about some parent's behaviour during pick up and drop off times in Collins Crescent. It saddens me to hear that they have been spoken to inappropriately and have been unable to access their driveway to their own property as parents have parked over or even in their driveway. I have contacted the City of Casey again to inform them of the issues and the Bylaws officer will be attending the area again. Please respect our residents, and park within the designated areas. Thank you to the parents who are doing the correct thing each day and using the drop off zone and car park spaces available.

### **SCHOOL HOLIDAY WORKS**

Over the school holidays we will be having the carpet in the main building replaced with carpet tiles and a large proportion of the concrete around the school will be replaced. These are both OHS related, and we look forward to this work being completed in time for the start of term 3. Due to needing to prepare the classrooms for the carpet, our grades in the main building will be relocated on Thursday and Friday next week to other classrooms within the school. Parents will be notified early next week where the grades will be located. This only affects our prep classes, IB, IR and 2LM.

### FRIENDS OF WILSON BOTANICAL PARK TALK

Last Sunday I was invited to be the guest speaker at the quarterly meeting of the Friends of Wilson Botanical Park. It was a privilege to speak to the group and share our school's journey in building our gardens which were started in 2014. I led the projects including the Community, Sensory, Memorial and Outdoor Common Room Garden. A wonderful accolade for the school was winning the Victorian Schools Garden Program State Award in 2018. It was a wonderful opportunity to share our environmental activities with the broader community. Our school gardens were built by our community with many parents, teachers, staff and friends assisting over a few years. Materials and items were donated, grants were written and won, and our students were actively involved in planting all garden areas. ### Dear Berwick Lodge PS Parents/Carers,

It has been reported to council by residents that our families are driving and parking around our precinct dangerously. The safety of our children and community is important to us – please read the attached and follow the road and parking rules. Be respectful to other drivers, pedestrians and our school crossing supervisors.

Highway Patrol and Parking Officers have been advised of the dangerous behaviour and our area will be more regularly patrolled.



The Drop off Pick up Zone on Collins Ave as marked on the map is strictly a 2 Minute zone during the times on the sign.

Always move to the top of the zone – do not park in the middle of the zone. Do not que in this area as this zone is very small and the road is narrow. Cars need to keep moving!

### DO NOT BLOCK RESIDENT'S DRIVEWAYS OR PARK ON THE NATURE STRIPS IN THIS AREA

If you arrive early to school, please <u>DO NOT</u> park in this zone – fines apply. Find a park in the nearby reserve to park and walk or one of the courts nearby. You have plenty of park and walk options in your community – look at your Walking Route Map.





Respect and look after your school crossing supervisors – they are there to control the flow of the traffic and cross children and families safely during the peak times.

As a driver, make sure you do not move until all pedestrians <u>including</u> the crossing supervisor are off the road completely.

### Information Regarding Fire at Hallam Retail and Warehouse Location

Last night, there was unfortunately a significant fire at our retail and warehouse location at 151-159 Princes Hwy, Hallam. As a result, we have lost a substantial amount of stock that was kept on-site, and will not be able to operate out of the retail space. As this is very recent, we are still responding to the situation and working out the best approaches to ensure we can replenish the lost stock as quickly as we can. We will of course be endeavouring to resume retail operations as soon as possible, however at this stage we do not know what that will look like. We will provide updates on the situation as soon as we know more.

This will have the most noticeable impact on the schools that we sell for in our Hallam store, however as it is one of our primary warehousing locations as well, the loss of stock will impact all schools to a degree. We know that this is not an ideal situation, however we ask for your patience and understanding for any delays or stock shortages that result from this unprecedented situation. It is not a situation that can be prepared for in advance, but we will respond as thoroughly and as quickly as we can to each stock shortage.

For any families who need to purchase for an impacted school, our online store is still available at <a href="www.beleza.com.au/online-store/">www.beleza.com.au/online-store/</a>. We will be fulfilling orders as quickly as possible, however with the combination of pre-existing School Saving Bonus orders and the stock shortages resulting from this fire, please be advised that there may be significant wait times due to processing and production requirements.

We don't have any additional information at this stage, but will provide further updates as soon as we know more. We'd like to thank you for your patience at this time.




### Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

Thank you to our lovely families for donating recycled materials to help us with our projects!! Have a




Unfortunately, we are **unable** to accept any more book donations at this time.






