PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

WELCOME BACK EVERYONE

We have had a wonderful start to the school year with our students settling into their new classes and getting to know their teachers and new friends. It was lovely to see the excitement last week on the first day of school, especially with our new Prep students and families. We have had a very busy holiday break with works happening around the school, some of which are continuing. Our main front office areas were repainted as a part of our ongoing maintenance plan, the retainer wall in the courtyard is currently being replaced and very excitingly, our junior basketball court, which was achieved through the PFA fundraising, was completed last Friday. If you haven't seen the basketball court yet, it is located on the junior oval towards the back of the BER/library building.



MEET THE TEACHER COMMUNITY AFTERNOON: MONDAY 16th FEBRUARY

Monday 16th February is our "Welcome to Berwick Lodge – Meet the Teacher" community afternoon for families to informally visit the classroom and meet their child's teacher between 3.35pm and 4.35pm. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

FOOD ALLERGIES

We have a few students within our school who are anaphylactic. We are not a nut free school, but we strongly encourage families to please support us in keeping everyone safe and save common nut products such as peanut butter and Nutella to have on the weekends. Even if there is no student in your child's grade with anaphylaxis, all students share spaces across the school such as specialist classes and digital devices.

DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

We remind families that you can't bring your dog onto the school grounds. We do have some students who fear dogs or may be allergic. If you walk your dog to school, please don't tie your dog up on an external fence near our school gates. Students and families need to be able to safely enter the school grounds.

EVACUATION DRILL

Each term we are required to participate in an evacuation or lock down drill. This is to check our procedures for safely moving students to our meeting points. Next week we will be having an evacuation drill where grades will move from their classrooms to our designated meeting point on the oval. Please talk to your child about this and discuss that this is a practise so we will all know what to do safely if there ever was a real emergency. Teachers will also be discussing this in class.

CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

All staff and parents who volunteer within the school are required to complete a Child Safe Standards induction annually. Our Child Safe Standards policies are available on our school website for parents/volunteers to access. If parents have any questions or feedback, please contact the school.

PARENT HELPER INDUCTION

We welcome parents to volunteer to assist with school activities including excursions, camps and within classrooms. All parents need to have a current working with children card which needs to be on file in our office to then be able to complete our school induction prior to assisting at school. **Parents and volunteers are required to complete the induction every 12 months.** Our next school inductions will be held on:

Assistant Principals' Report



SUNSMART

★ Ultraviolet (UV) radiation exposure during childhood and adolescence has a big impact on future skin cancer risk. Students are in school when daily UV levels are at their peak, meaning schools are uniquely placed to educate about sun protection behaviour, minimise UV exposure and ultimately reduce a student's lifetime risk of skin cancer.



★ All students at Berwick Lodge are required to have a SunSmart hat due to UV rating. If they don't have a hat, they will be required to play in the shade. On warm weather days, students are always instructed by their teachers to play in the shade at all times and keep themselves hydrated with water. All children should have a water bottle at school. Please ensure the hat and drink bottle has a name label, as these frequently go missing. Please remind and support your child to apply sunscreen before school and send sunscreen to school for reapplication during the day. Teachers are unable to apply sunscreen to students.

SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL

★ A reminder to parents that the best time for their children to arrive is between 8:45am and 8:55am, when the teaching staff are on duty supervising the yard. The yard is supervised by staff between 3:30pm and 3:45pm after school. Students in the playground outside supervision times are at risk. If it is necessary for children to be at school either early or late, then parents should consider enrolment in the OSHC Program or make other arrangements. If for any reason your child has not been picked up by 3:45pm they will be directed to the front office area where they must wait until they are collected. These measures are not meant to cause any inconvenience; they are for the safety and security of all our students.



What a fantastic start to the year we've had in the Grade 5/6 area!



HOUSE ATHLETICS DAY - GRADES 3-6

Berwick Lodge's annual House Athletics Day for Grades 3-6 will be held on Thursday 5th March beginning at approximately 9:15am. Students are encouraged to wear their house colours for the day as well as clothing that is comfortable for them to participate in.

Students will walk around in their age group (age as of 31/12/26) and compete in 7 events on the day. Students have been placed in age groups according to their age based on the School Sport Victoria guidelines.

There is flexibility in which age group your child competes in however your child must be aware of the guidelines involved in competing up or down an age group. If a student chooses to compete up an age group they will need to remain in this age group if they were to progress to represent the school at district, divisional, regional or state events. If your child would like to compete in an age group other than their assigned one, please let myself know via email. .

As this is a whole day event, students must wear their hats and bring plenty of water to drink. It is advisable that students have sunscreen applied in the morning before school and bring their OWN sunscreen to school so that they can reapply this in the recess and lunchtime breaks. Schools and teachers are not allowed to provide or apply sunscreen to students.

Parents are more than welcome to come and spectate but must remain out of the way of events and behind fenced areas to allow for the smooth transition and running of each of the events. Parents must also leave the school grounds during recess and lunchtime breaks.

We are seeking at least 8 parent helpers. Berwick Lodge canteen LUNCH ordering system called Qkr (pronounced Quicker) is available for canteen lunch orders

Qkr by MasterCard can be downloaded for **FREE** from Apple's App store for iPhones, iPhone app for iPads, or from Google Play for Android phones and tablets.

What families need to do TO SET UP ORDERING:

- Download the Qkr App to your phone or tablet.
 - Register
 - Find our School: Berwick Lodge P.S (from "Nearby Locations")
 - Register your child/ren – Select Student Profile
 - Order Meals (you can change, cancel or repeat orders)
 - Make Payment: Up to 5 cards can be linked.
- **To CANCEL an order:** Open the QKR app and tap Activity, scroll to order history, tap the red circle with the minus symbol to cancel. Cancelling needs to be done prior to close off at 9.00am for that day.

NO COST TO DOWNLOAD THE APP!!

NO FEES, NO ACCOUNTS, you pay as you go for food only!!

- Online orders must be placed / or cancelled by 9.00am, as the online order system will close shortly after.
- Orders can be placed online up to 2 weeks ahead.
- Make sure you link your child with the correct year level and home group.



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
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
