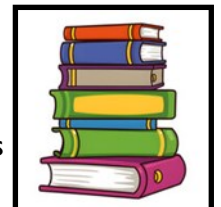
PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

LAST DAY OF TERM FINISH FRIDAY 26th JUNE AT 2:30PM

On Friday 26th June our school day will end at 2:30pm. Please organise to collect your child at this time or book them into the CAMP Australia after school care program. Term 3 starts on Monday 13th July.

PRINCIPALS VISIT THIS WEEK

On Tuesday morning we hosted Principals and Assistant Principals from three local schools and our Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) from our Department of Education regional office who came to view and learn about our approach to explicitly teach reading within our Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 classes. We are successfully implementing the new Department of Education Phonics Plus lessons across our junior grades, which we introduced last year. The visitors were very impressed with the calm learning environment where all students were engaged and focused on learning the sounds, letters and words to develop their reading skills. A very big thank you to our F-2 teachers who have worked incredibly hard to provide a very structured, focused approach to teaching reading. With the holidays approaching shortly, we strongly encourage all families to continue reading over the break and consider visiting the local library to encourage a love of reading. REFUGEE WEEK



Refugee Week 2026 in Australia runs from **Sunday 14th June to Saturday 20th June 2026**. The national theme for the 40th anniversary of the event is "A Million Stories". One million refugees have been welcomed by Australia since World War II. Refugee Week is a moment to reflect on that milestone and to celebrate the million stories behind it.

A refugee is an individual who has been forced to flee their home country to escape war, violence, conflict, or severe persecution. As it is unsafe for them to stay or return home, they cross international borders to seek safety.

LATE ARRIVALS

Student punctuality is equally important. At the beginning of the day students are informed of the day's program, events and important instructions are often given. Students arriving late to school (after 9:00 am) also disrupt the class they are in, as they get organised and settled for the day. Your co-operation on this matter would be greatly appreciated. LITERACY

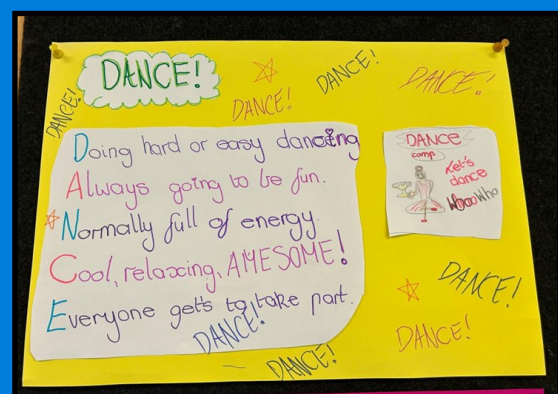
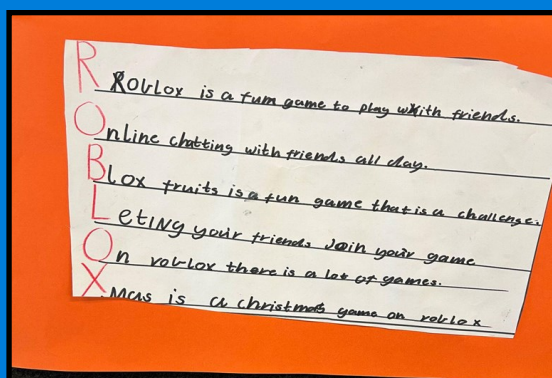
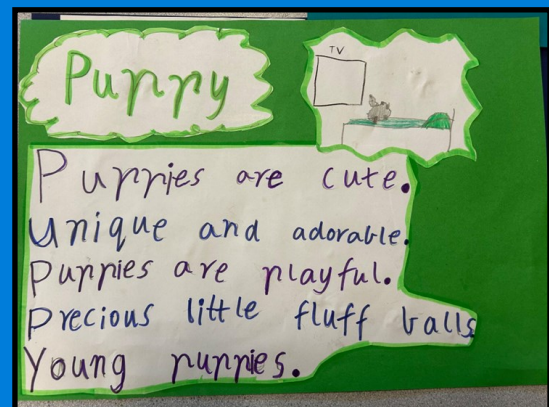
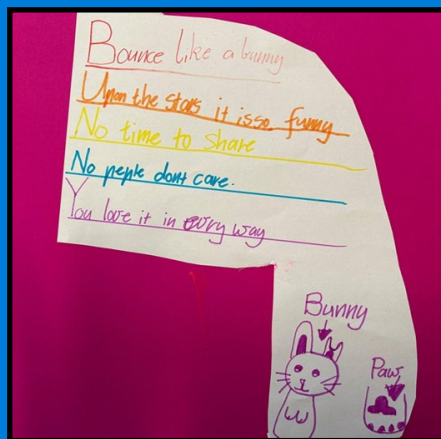
Our Grade 3/4 students have been exploring the wonderful world of poetry. They have been learning about different poetic devices, including alliteration and how poets use language to create interesting effects for readers. As part of their learning, students created colourful posters showcasing examples of alliteration.

MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics, our Grade 3/4 students have been developing their understanding of money and shapes. Students have been practising identifying the value of coins and notes, calculating amounts and solving real-world money problems. They have also been exploring the features of 2D and 3D shapes, identifying their properties and using mathematical language to describe them. It has been wonderful to see students applying their learning through hands-on activities and problem-solving tasks.

INQUIRY

In Inquiry, our Grade 4 students have been investigating different materials and exploring their properties and uses in everyday life. Our Grade 3 students have been learning about heat, including how it is produced, transferred and used. They are excited to extend their learning during the upcoming **Mad About Science** incursion on Friday the 12th of June, where they will participate in engaging hands-on activities and experiments.



GRADE 5/6 NEWS

Over the past two weeks, the Grade 5 and 6 students have been busy engaging in a variety of exciting learning experiences.

Our Grade 5 students enjoyed meeting their Grade 3 buddies for the first time, beginning to build friendships and demonstrate their leadership skills across the school. In Science, students have been investigating chemical change, exploring how different substances can react to create new materials and observing the signs that indicate a chemical reaction has occurred.

In the coming week, students are preparing to begin a Geography unit focused on the countries of Asia, where they will learn about the region's diverse cultures, environments, populations and landmarks.



art news



Term 2 in the Art Room has been a busy time. At the beginning of the term we were a flurry of feathers as each cohort worked on a different bird artwork. This was a fitting celebration as our collaborative piece we began at the start of the school year featuring our school logo, the helmeted honeyeater, was mounted outside the Art Room.



For Reconciliation Week we explored different elements of storytelling through art, used by Indigenous Australians. We learned about pattern paintings, the use of lines in landscapes and how constellations signal the changing of the seasons.



Art Club has been very popular with junior students this term. All students are welcome into the Art Room during the first half of lunchtime on Tuesdays (weather permitting) to participate in optional art activities. This term saw students creating Mothers Day cards, painting, beading, using coloured cellophane to create window decorations and, most recently, collages with holographic paper.

We are now in the final weeks of our six-week *Tuning in to Kids* program, and it has proven to be an incredibly valuable experience for those attending. The program provides parents and carers with practical insights into understanding children's emotions, recognising early signs of dysregulation, and developing effective emotion coaching skills.

Participants have also had the opportunity to explore these concepts through a neurodiversity-informed lens, gaining a deeper understanding of how children experience and express emotions. We are grateful to everyone who has participated and encourage families to take advantage of future ParentZone programs when they become available.

These sessions are offered free of charge and provide a wonderful opportunity to build knowledge, confidence, and connections within our school community.
